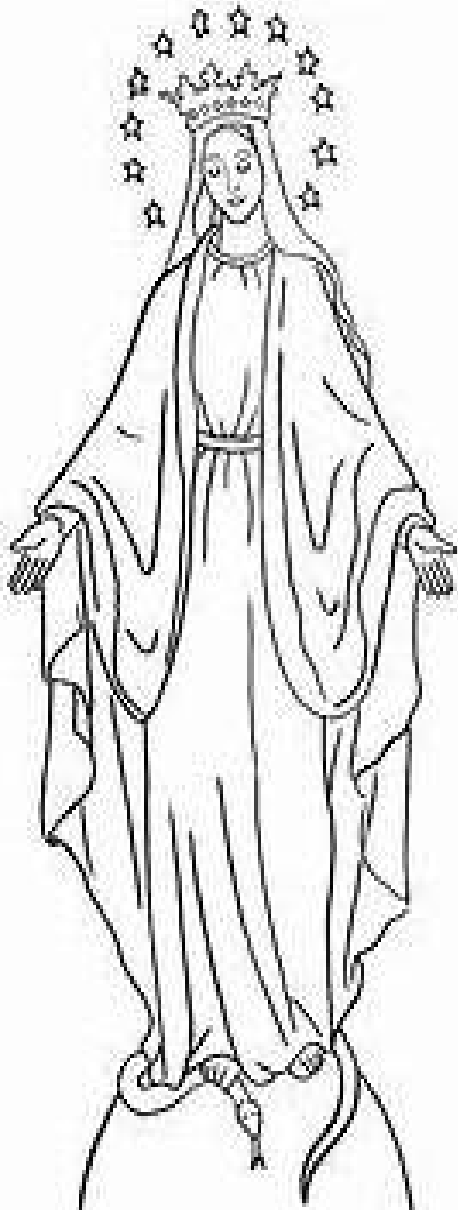

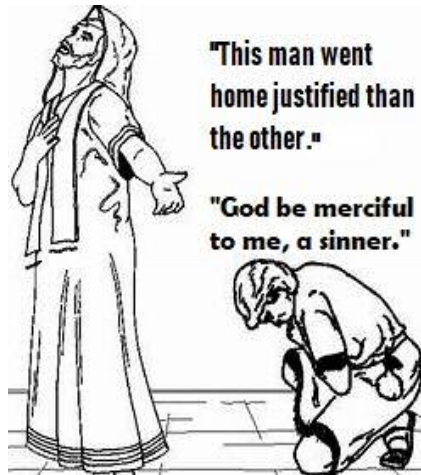

Just as we pray for each other and share each other's burdens now, the faithful on earth can offer prayers and sacrifices to help the departed souls undergoing purification, and no better prayer could be offered than that of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Envelopes for Nov 2 "All Souls' Day" are available at the front door. You may write their names in the envelope as your special intentions at Mass to be celebrated Nov 2 Saturday 11:00AM at Our Lady of Mercy chapel. Also, in all Sunday Masses of November they are included in the intention.

The Lord expects great things from you!" "Go and show love to everyone, because your life is a precious mission: it is not a burden to be borne, but a gift to offer."

All Saints' Day (Nov 1) From the first centuries after Christ, Christians who died a martyr's death were considered saints, who live in God's presence forever. Every year, on the anniversary of the martyrs' deaths, Christians would visit their tombs and celebrate the Eucharist. This practice grew throughout the centuries to include remembering other outstanding Christians on the days they died. Soon the entire calendar was filled with memorials of the saints. In the ninth century, Pope Gregory IV designated November 1 as the day to remember all the saints living in God's presence. This is a celebration for the Christians to remind us of the depth and breadth of Christians who came before us. and all the saints of Christendom throughout the world. Their work enabled the Christian religion to be what it is now.

All Souls' Day (Nov 2) - All Souls' Day is founded on the doctrine that the souls of those who have died without achieving moral perfection may be aided in achieving beatific vision in heaven through prayer and offerings from the living. Praying for the dead is a Christian obligation. We join to all in praying for family and loved ones who have died. In the modern world, when many have come to doubt the Church's teaching on Purgatory, the need for such prayers has only increased.
