Father Charles Orchard's long journey from his youth in Cobourg to his recent appointment as a full-time associate at St. Peter-In-Chains Cathedral, Peterborough has taken him to Ottawa, where he has ministered in a dozen parishes, to a mission in the Philippine province of Batangas, to a Companions of the



Cross formation house in Detroit and to St.Timothy's Parish in North York where he arrived just in time to take charge of a \$1.6 million renovation. While Peterborough isn't his hometown, it's close enough and that proximity to Cobourg and his parents is what brought him to St. Peter's when the cathedral was in need of a parish associate. "I felt the tug to be close to my parents and to work in my home area," says Father Orchard. "As priests, we're pulled in many directions — to serve where we're needed, to maintain contact with family and, in my case, community." Father Orchard's call to the priesthood was neither sudden nor dramatic, but a slow process of formation that began after his Grade 9 year when he attended a Charismatic Renewal Conference with parents, Rod and Cathy, who were very active in the Church (Published by "Spotlight on the Cathedral"). POPE FRANCIS ON ST. FRANCIS XAVIER - "The love of Christ was the strength that drove St. Xavier to the furthest frontiers, with constant toil and danger, overcoming setbacks, disappointments and discouragement, indeed, giving him consolation and joy in following and serving Him to the end. He never left prayer, because he knew there was strength there."

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF ASCENSION- "It is plain from Scripture that Jesus' ascension was a literal, bodily return to heaven. He rose from the ground gradually and visibly, observed by many intent onlookers. A cloud hid Him from their view, and two angels appeared and promised Christ's return "in just the same way that you have watched Him go" (Acts 1:11). The Scriptures frequently picture Him at the right hand of the Father-a position of honor and authority. Christ is the Head of the Church the giver of spiritual gifts, and the One who fills all in all."

BISHOP DANIEL MIEHM on MAID- "The Canadian conference of Catholic Bishops issued two letters about access to Euthanasia/Medical Assistance in Dying for those living with mental illness. One is addressed to the government and another to all the Catholic faithful. The bishops raise serious concerns about expanding the eligibility criteria for "MAID" to those whose sole medical condition is mental illness. They note that Euthanasia always violates the dignity of the human person and to extend this "treatment" to those suffering from mental illness reneges on our societal responsibility to provide support, caring and proper therapeutic interventions in such cases. I appeal that we should write to our Members of Parliament about this deeply concerning issue."

THE BIBLE, GOD'S WORD- "The scriptures give us specific instructions on how to prosper and be blessed in this life. There are numerous verses found throughout the Bible which offer promises for those who love God's Word, and particularly for those who read it often and meditate on its words. Psalms 1:1-3, "Blessed is the one whose delight is in the word of the Lord, and who meditates on His word day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither - WHATEVER THEY DO PROSPERS." And again, in Joshua 1:7-8, "Keep this Book of the law always on your lips, MEDITATE on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be PROSPEROUS and SUCCESSFUL."
