

Gospel Today *Mark 6:1-6*- "This Gospel tells us that Jesus is hampered from performing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith." Who is Jesus? His kinfolk in Nazareth might know the carpenter, the son of Mary, but they do not know Jesus, the Son of God. Mark is foreshadowing Jesus' rejection by his own people, the people of Israel. By showing that Jesus himself was rejected, Mark consoles and reassures his first readers. He also prepares us to accept this possible consequence of Christian discipleship."

Step 2 Reopening

— The Ontario provincial government announced that the province will be moving into Step 2 of the Reopening Strategy Wednesday, June 30th. Step 2 moves to a capacity limit of 25% for places of worship. This means that starting Sunday July 4th, 48 people can attend Sunday Mass in Port Severn and 75 people in Honey Harbour.

The best saints to pray to during a pandemic – St.

Sebastian – "If there is one institution which has endured more plagues than any other – and done so with fortitude and grace – it is the Catholic Church. The saints have always played a central role in the Church's response to plagues, and now that the world faces a new one, they are being asked to intercede once again. Perhaps the most famous plague saint is St Sebastian. After his embrace of Christianity in the 3rd century, Sebastian joined the Roman army to help other Christians being persecuted by the Romans. Even as he became an elite member of the Praetorian Guard, under the notorious anti-Christian Emperor Diocletian, Sebastian secretly brought many soldiers into the Church. But as soon as his courageous witness was discovered, Diocletian ordered Sebastian to be executed. Tied to a post, Sebastian was pierced with a band of arrows and left for dead – until a Christian woman, Irene of Rome, found him breathing, astonishingly, and nursed him back to health. Sebastian became a hero to Christians everywhere. Records reveal that St Sebastian was celebrated for protecting the faithful against plagues. St Sebastian became a symbol for suffering humanity during recurring plagues, and his miraculous recovery gave those afflicted hope and consolation. Abbeys, churches and basilicas were founded in his name; and after the recent outbreak of coronavirus, Sebastian was one of the first saints Catholics were encouraged to pray to."

Finding Hope in the Midst of a Pandemic – "During this crisis, it is normal and natural to ask where God is. But this is not a time for Christians to retreat from their faith. We feel a deep sense of precariousness in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic. We realise how fragile and vulnerable we are to outbreaks of infectious diseases. It is as if we are suddenly blindsided and brought to a standstill by the pestilence. Unsure of what will happen next, we often take a deep breath to calm our racing pulses. A Life with faith in God is a journey undertaken with the hope of reaching the destination: "God who is our home". Ups and downs are normal in this "arduous" journey, and it is through ups and downs that we grow in faith. The Bible invites us to trust that, if God allows pain, he will give us the strength to go through it, and he will show us the way out of it. We pray that God will help us to know his peace, comfort, and healing in the midst of the pandemic, or any other suffering that we may go through in life."
