

Some items to read at the back page

LENT (by Pope Benedict XV1)- "Each year, Lent offers us a providential opportunity to deepen the meaning and value of our Christian lives, and it stimulates us to rediscover the mercy of God. In the Lenten period, the Church makes it her duty to propose some specific tasks that accompany the faithful concretely in this process of interior renewal, namely: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving." Christians are asked to return to God "with all their hearts". Even when we sin, God patiently awaits our return; by that patient expectation, he shows us his readiness to forgive. The observance of Lent is the very badge of the Christian warfare. By it we prove ourselves not to be enemies of Christ. By it we avert the scourges of divine justice. By it we gain strength against the princes of darkness, for it shields us with heavenly help. Should mankind grow remiss in their observance of Lent, it would be a detriment to God's glory, a disgrace to the Catholic religion, and a danger to Christian souls.

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE CARITAS CANADA ("Stand for the Land" Campaign 2023) – "Around the world, many communities are mobilizing to defend their territories against threats posed by extractive industries and industrial agriculture. These people are often threatened, criminalized, or even killed when they stand up to protect their lands, their livelihoods and their very existence. Development and Peace – Caritas Canada stands in solidarity with these peoples. With our partners, we support communities' efforts to protect their territories and biodiversity for present and future generations."

STOP THIS WAR! — "Pope Francis continues to raise his voice for peace. He has made countless appeals, crying out, in harmony with his predecessors, his heartfelt "No to war!" It is the same "Never again war!" that Saint Paul VI pleaded in front of the United Nations Assembly on 4 October 1965; it is that "Never again war!" that Saint John Paul II cried out at the Angelus of 16 March 2003, to avert the wretched invasion of Iraq. "A victory built on rubble will never be a true victory! And the wounds of hatred and resentment that the barbarity of war has caused will remain for certainly longer than the time needed to rebuild Ukraine", he said.

WHY BELIEVE IN GOD? "As humans indulge in their passions, their desires continue to go unfulfilled. Many attempt to fill the void with increasing worldly pleasures with little results. Such powerful and elusive desires are a cry from the soul which seeks something that can not be gratified by the things of this world. For the moment we will consider discontent of the heart as a mark of God calling us to embrace him."
