

<u>FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER</u>, often known as Good Shepherd Sunday, is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. First established by Pope Paul VI in 1964, this is now the 60th time we are celebrating the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Reflecting on the theme of Grace and Mission, Pope Francis has written, "This day is a precious opportunity for recalling with wonder that the Lord's call is grace, complete gift, and at the same time a commitment to bring the Gospel to others."

"THE BIBLE, GOD'S WORD — "It is Divinely Inspired by God Himself. Some have called the Bible "God's Handbook" for His children. When we consider that God is the One who created all things... the universe... the earth and everything in it... and particularly mankind... giving us breath and life and purpose, it makes perfect sense that He would give us a guidebook on how to live this life to its fullest, according to His plan. And that is exactly what He has done. He is the author of His Word and has given it to us as a valuable gift, to help us live a fulfilling life. This is what St. Paul in his 2nd letter to Timothy 3:16-17 is telling about: "All scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

COUNCIL OF CARDINALS – "A two-day meeting in Vatican of the Council of Cardinals discusses ongoing wars and need for peace-building. The report read: "At the centre of the conversation were the situations of wars and conflicts in which many parts of the world find themselves and the need for a united peace-building effort on the part of the entire Church." NICARAGUA – "As anti-Catholic persecution goes on in Nicaragua, U.S. bishops reaffirm their solidarity with the Nicaraguan Church and call on the international community to continue to work for the restoration of peace in the Latin American country. President Daniel Ortega's authoritarian regime continues its crackdown and attacks against the Catholic Church in Nicaragua, despite international outcry from the UN, Churches and human rights organizations worldwide. Last week, Ortega again violently accused the Nicaraguan Bishops' Conference and the Vatican, of being "demons" and "criminals." In solidarity with the Church in Nicaragua, the U.S. Bishops said: "Despite these extreme hardships, the Nicaraguan faithful, in union with their bishops and priests, have resiliently borne witness to the power of Christ's resurrection."
