POPE FRANCIS SENDS AID TO QUAKE-STRUCK TURKEY & SYRIA - Nine days after the powerful earthquakes, the rising death toll has topped 41,000. Millions of people have been left without a home and a livelihood. While the Pope issued his appeal for closeness and concrete support to alleviate the pain of those who are suffering from the disaster, he too put words into action by sending aid through the Dicastery for the Service of Charity. "Don't forget those who suffer. May our concrete aid sustain them in the midst of this appalling tragedy", he said.

ASH WEDENESDAY MASS - This coming Wednesday, the celebration of the Mass and the giving of ashes will take place at 11 in the morning in Port Severn Church. The ashes of this holiday symbolize two main things: death and repentance. Ashes are equivalent to dust, and human flesh is composed of dust or clay, and when a human corpse decomposes, it returns to dust or ash. For



example, Abraham told God, "I am but dust and ashes" (Genesis 18:27), a reference to his human mortality. We use ashes on Ash Wednesday to remind ourselves of our own impending deaths. Death may come sooner, or it may come later, but it will surely come. And if death is coming, we need to be prepared, and the time to prepare for death is now, and the way to prepare is to live according to God's ways. Ash Wednesday falls this week, and with it begins the holy season of Lent. This season of prayer, penance and almsgiving prepares the faithful for the celebration of the great mysteries of our faith in Holy Week and Easter.

EMERGENCY CAMPAIGN – The devastation of the earthquakes in Turkey & Syria is causing human suffering on an unimaginable scale. As Catholics, we are compelled to come to the aid of our brothers and sisters in dire circumstances, like the thousands that have lost loved ones or are injured and have lost their homes. The Diocese of Peterborough will join in the campaign organized by the Canadian Bishops and Catholic relief to provide much needed assistance to victims of this terrible earthquake. You may donate using envelope and marking it, "For Earthquake Victims", then drop it in the collection basket.

INDIGENOUS RECONCILIATION FUND COLLECTIONS - The second of three Diocesan Collections for the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund takes place today, Sunday February 19. Your donations will help the Diocese of Peterborough meet its responsibilities to the 30-million-dollar IRF commitment made by the Catholic Bishops of Canada. Projects are vetted at both a local and national committee level with funds going to support initiatives for healing and reconciliation, Indigenous culture, language and spirituality, and education and community building. A final IRF collection will take place in our diocese in the month of November.
