

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE – “The annual Share Lent collection is taken up in our churches on the 5th Sunday of Lent (next week) on what is known as Solidarity Sunday. Because of the COVID challenges of the past two years, our support is needed more urgently than ever. Let’s be as generous as we can in donating to this campaign!”

POPE FRANCIS: “I would like to take a minute to remember the victims of the war. The news of displaced persons, of people fleeing, of people killed, people wounded, of so many soldiers fallen on both sides, is news of death. With war everything is lost, everything. There is no victory in a war: everything is defeated. At this dark hour, the Church is urgently called to intercede before the Prince of Peace and to demonstrate her closeness to those directly affected by the conflict.”

THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD – “This feast is a joint celebration of Christ and Blessed Virgin: of the Word who becomes the Son of Mary and of the virgin who becomes the Mother of God. In the universal Church, this liturgy celebrates the beginning of redemption. It also honors Mary as the ‘new Eve’, the obedient and faithful woman who generously agrees to be the Mother of God. Mary cooperates freely in the plan of salvation.”

MARTYRS FOR CHRISTIAN FAITH – “In history, hundreds of early Christians have faced persecution for their faith. It is believed that the Roman Catholic Church was born out of the martyrdom of its members. A Christian martyr is someone willing to face death rather than deny Jesus Christ or his Gospel. Beheading, stoning, crucifixion, throwing to lion’s dens, and burning at stake were some of the horrific ways they were punished for their beliefs.” **St. Dymphna** was born in Ireland in the seventh century to a pagan father and a devout Christian mother. She consecrated herself to Christ when she was fourteen, and took a vow of chastity. Her mother died and her father began to suffer mental stability. The King’s counselors suggested he remarry. Damon, St. Dymphna’s father, sent messengers throughout his town and other lands to find a noblewoman who resembled his wife and would be willing to marry him. However, none was found, and his wicked advisers suggested he marry his daughter instead. St. Dymphna fled her home after she heard her father’s twisted plan. Together with two trusted servants and a priest, they sailed towards Belgium and hid in the town of Geel. Damon found the whereabouts of his daughter and traveled to Geel to capture them. He ordered the priest to be beheaded and attempted to convince his daughter to return to Ireland and marry him. Dymphna refused and her father enraged and beheaded her with his own hands. After Damon fled, the residents retrieved the remains of St. Dymphna and the priest and buried them in a cave. St. Dymphna was given the crown of martyrdom in 620 in defense of her martyrdom, and she was hailed as the “Lily of Eire.” St. Dymphna is the patroness of the people suffering from mental illnesses as well as the victims of incest.”
