

US BISHOPS WELCOME SUPREME COURT DECISION OVERTURNING ROE VS WADE

The Bishops of the United States thank God for Friday's Supreme Court decision overturning Roe v Wade, the 1973 ruling which legalized and normalized the taking of innocent human life through abortion. "For nearly fifty years, America has enforced an unjust law that has permitted some to decide whether others can live or die; this policy has resulted in the deaths of tens of millions of preborn children, generations that were denied the right to even be born." "It marked a grievous denial of the truth that all men and women are created equal, with God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." "As a Church, we need to serve those who face difficult pregnancies and surround them with love. We share their joy today and we are grateful to them."

BISHOP'S APPEAL - The Bishop's Appeal for 2022 will take place today, Sunday July 3 and next Sunday July 10, and it has been designated for the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has made a financial pledge of \$30 million dollars nationally and established the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund ("Fund"). Dioceses across Canada are joining this financial pledge and the Diocese of Peterborough will be contributing \$400 000. The Fund will support Indigenous Peoples generated projects in these four areas: Healing and reconciliation for communities and families; Culture and language revitalization; Education and community building; and Dialogues for promoting indigenous spirituality and culture.

POPE FRANCIS - The pope decries "barbaric" attacks in Ukraine and prays for end of war. "Every day, I carry in my heart the dear and tormented Ukraine, which continues to be scourged by barbaric attacks. I pray that this mad war may soon see an end, and I renew the invitation to persevere, without tiring, in prayer for peace: may the Lord open paths of dialogue that men are unwilling or unable to find!"

PRAY FOR CANADA - "We start this month of July by celebrating Canada's birthday! Let us give thanks for this land where we live and call home – a land of beauty and peace, a safe haven for those who are fleeing violence and persecution with hopes of building a new life and a new future for themselves and their families. Canadians should seek to be witnesses to Christ in Canada and the world. Christians, realizing they do not have a lasting home here, should pray and work for justice and peace in Canada and throughout the world, so that all God's people may share in the goods of this earth. God's kingdom will come only when all people are ready to let Christ's teaching guide and rule their lives and actions." *Living with Christ*
