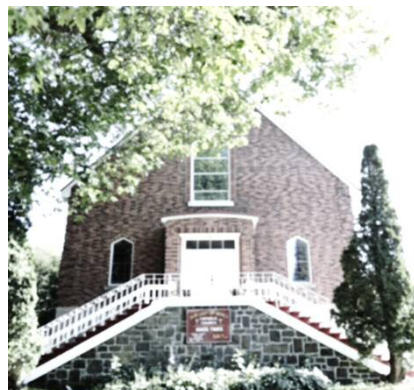

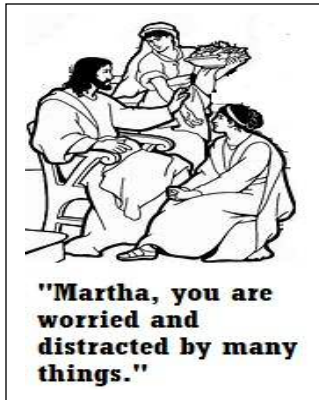

### WELCOME TO CHRISTIAN CATHOLIC COMMUNITY – Jaymeson

James Lamoreux, son of Jeremy and Kira Moreau, is going to receive the Sacrament of Baptism at the 11am Mass in Honey Harbour. Baptism marks an important milestone in a person's faith journey. As we welcome Jameson to our community of faith, we pray that he may be filled with the Holy Spirit, may remain faithful to his baptism, and that God's will may guide him throughout his life.

**BAPTISM** – "This sacrament has been undisputed in the Church since the beginning of Christian tradition. It has never been rejected by any heresy intending to remain on a Christian basis. Baptism is the sacrament that frees man from original sin and from personal guilt. It is thus the door to a new and supernatural life, necessary for man's salvation. The Church teaches that Baptism is a true sacrament instituted by Christ. It confers sanctifying grace, membership in Christ and in the Church and the obligation to obey the Church's laws, and give an indelible character. Through our Baptism, we are called to live a life in allegiance to God."

**POPE FRANCIS** – "The pope implored the authorities of Sri Lanka to listen to the cries of their people. "I join in the grief of the people of Sri Lanka, who continue to suffer the effects of political and economic instability. Together with the country's bishops, I renew my call for peace and implore those in authority not to ignore the cry of the poor and the needs of the people." Sri Lanka has run out of foreign currency as it experiences its worst economic crisis in 70 years. The country's 22 million people are suffering under unchecked inflation and the government's inability to import fuel, food, and medicine."

### **ARCHBISHOP GALLAGHER: (Pope is committed to going to Ukraine) -**

Archbishop Paul Richard Gallagher says Pope Francis plans to go to Kyiv, Ukraine, as soon as possible, underlining however that "the when and how we do not know." He reaffirmed the Pope's interest in visiting the nation under attack, reflected on his own trip to the war-devastated nation recently, and on what he called 'diplomatic failures' that did not work hard enough to prevent the war, despite warning signs. "I registered dismay and disbelief to find myself in the war in Europe." "At home it was my father and my grandfather who told about war. I saw destruction, protection and all this is a scandal for us. I saw a people resist, ready to fight and win. All this happened to us, in our time, while we thought that the war was now closed for Europe." "We must instead continue to remember Ukraine, the war, keeping attention high for a peace project of the Spirit of God, to rediscover peace, a gift of God with which man must collaborate."

**HEALING AND RECONCILIATION: An Historic Journey** -Pope Francis will make a pastoral visit to Canada from July 24 to 29, 2022. The Pope's visit will provide a unique opportunity for him, once again, to listen and dialogue with Indigenous Peoples, to express his heartfelt closeness and to address the impact of colonization and the participation of the Catholic Church in the operation of residential schools throughout Canada. "I ask for God's forgiveness and I want to say to you with all my heart: I am very sorry. And I join my brothers, the Canadian bishops, in asking your pardon."
