TRANSFIGURATION OF CHRIST (feast day August 6) – “There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light” (Mat17:2). Everything about this event would have been startling. The complete change, the obvious power emanating from Jesus, the meeting with Moses and Elijah, and the voice of the Father heard from heaven: this was an absolutely supernatural event with no other possible origin than God. Undoubtedly, the purpose of the transfiguration of Christ in part was so that his disciples could gain a greater understanding of who Jesus was, that he is divine and in order that the disciples could behold him in His glory. His ministry on Earth was to display the coming kingdom of God and reveal the pathway to citizenship in that kingdom. In order to do this, he revealed his divine nature to humanity in very real ways. The Transfiguration event was probably the most definitive revelation of Jesus as divine next to the resurrection itself. The appearance of Moses and Elijah represented the Law and the Prophets. But God’s voice from heaven – “Listen to Him!” - clearly showed that the Law and the Prophets must give way to Jesus. Christ is the fulfillment of the Law and the countless prophecies in the Old Testament and that he was the beginning of the new covenant of grace that brings humanity to salvation and glory to God.”

The Pope sat in a wheelchair before the silence of Lac Ste. Anne, a place dear to the indigenous people, where thousands go on pilgrimage each year. And there, as Pope Francis spoke, the hands of the grandparents clasped those of the younger ones to mutually support each other. Images of suffering, pride, passion, identity, dances, silence, prayer, and tears thus accompanied this penitential pilgrimage, which begins a new perspective and assigns tasks and goals to individuals and institutions, but which also represents an opportunity for all of humanity, for all of us, to follow paths of sharing and fraternity, to listen and set our gaze on humanity and Creation, realizing that we are all children of God.”
