



Bishop Niehm Letter (excerpt) - As Catholics, we are called to protect the most vulnerable members of our society and to see the inherent value of every person, made in the image of God. Recent trends in our nation and province should be of great concern for us as we strive to uphold the dignity of every person. The Federal Government is on the verge of expanding assisted dying in Canada. Passing Bill C-7 will mean expanding access to euthanasia and assisted suicide to the disabled, those with mental illness and those who have an advanced directive. Many Canadians are alarmed at the implications of Bill C-7 and have contacted their Federal Member of Parliament to express their concerns. I invite you to act by calling, e-mailing, or mailing a letter to the Ontario government through your own MPP.
