IMMACULATE CONCEPTION (Dec 8) – "The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way: "To become the mother of the Saviour, Mary "was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role." The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as "full of grace".

In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent to the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace. Through the centuries the Church has become ever more aware that Mary, "full of grace" through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses, as Pope Pius IX proclaimed in 1854: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." By giving Mary this grace from the first moment of her conception, God showed us an image of our own destiny. He shows us that this is possible for humans by his grace."

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST (The Preview of Jesus Christ) – "Both John the Baptist and Jesus have in Common: They were both the same age (born six months apart), they were both from the same extended family (Mary and Elizabeth were cousins), they both had righteous & godly parents (Zechariah/Elizabeth & Joseph/Mary), their births fulfilled Old Testament prophecy, their births were announced to their parents by the Archangel Gabriel, their names were divinely given by God, they began their public ministry near the age of 30, they both had a band of disciples, they both preached of a coming Messianic kingdom and a baptism of repentance, they were both righteous men who testified to God's Truth, and were condemned to death by Roman rulers. St. John the Baptist was truly the forerunner of the Messiah, always a step ahead of Jesus' ministry. John was born first, began his ministry first, and died a martyr's death first."

CHURCH TEACHING/POSITION On "Why Can't Non-Catholics Receive Communion?" How would we explain to non-Catholics that their not being allowed to receive the Eucharist is not the Catholic Church being exclusive? There are 2 main reasons: 1. Catholic Church believes that the Eucharist is the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ. We must be properly prepared to receive it (1 Cor. 11:26-29). A non-Catholic who does not believe in the Real Presence (but only symbol for protestants) would not be properly prepared to receive the Eucharist. 2. Notice the word communion. The word communion implies a unity and a oneness. Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life and worship, members of faith communities with whom we are not fully united are not admitted to Holy Communion."
