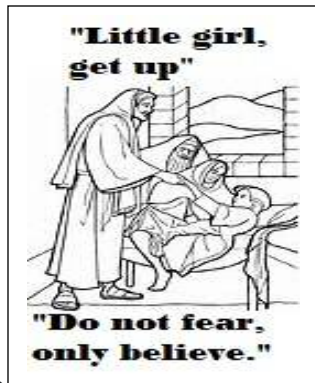

Gospel Today *Mark 5:21-43*- "Today's Gospel reports two stories of healing. One story tells us about a father's great love for his dying daughter. The other story tells us about a desperate woman who risks much as she seeks healing from Jesus. In each story, the request for healing is itself a courageous act of faith." In the face of miracles like the raising of the dead, why Jesus did not do it more frequently. The answer is that his miracle was a sign of the meaning of his mission and ours. His occasional raising of the dead reveals the meaning of everything he is doing at every moment. He is reconciling humanity to God, and hence destroying the very source of death. In the end, all will rise – but they are called first to come to Christ, who is Life itself, and embrace that gift of natural and supernatural life."

Step 2 Reopening – The Ontario provincial government announced that the province will be moving into Step 2 of the Reopening Strategy Wednesday, June 30th. Step 2 moves to a capacity limit of 25% for places of worship. This means that starting Sunday July 4th, 48 people can attend Sunday Mass in Port Severn and 75 people in Honey Harbour.

With building capacity now increased to 25% parishes will have an easier time welcoming the faithful. @“IN THIS YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH, Dioceses across the country are celebrating an ‘Act of Entrustment’, asking the intercession and protection of St. Joseph on our nation. He is the principal patron saint of Canada, and so this is often being done in conjunction with Canada Day. We have taped a Mass from our Cathedral which concludes with the Act of Entrustment and will be broadcast on July 1st. Additionally, the faithful are being urged to make the Novena leading up to Canada Day. @

“DISTURBING REPORTS ABOUT MORE UNMARKED GRAVES at a former Indian Residential School emerged this week, coming from Cowessess First Nation in Saskatchewan. This is another report that implicates the Church for its part in a reprehensible and destructive Residential School system. There are likely to be more such revelations as the summer goes on: difficult as they are to hear they are a necessary step in the ongoing process of truth and reconciliation. The letter from Archbishop Don Bolen of Regina to Chief Cadmus Delorme of Cowessess First Nation expresses the Church's sorrow and shame and commits to concrete acts to redress the harm that has been done. It is evident that the issue of this cemetery has been under discussion by Indigenous and Church leaders for some time. Several clergy and faithful have been present at the memorial gatherings sponsored by our local Indigenous peoples. And I see this as a hopeful step. Let us continue to pray for all those harmed by the Indian Residential School system and for our nation and Church, to commit to find ways to promote healing and rebuild trust.”
